Section 600 - Instruction Curriculum Development <u>Curriculum Evaluation</u>

The instruction program should be constantly evaluated by the teachers and administration. Such evaluation may be expected to lead to recommendations for modifications of practices, changes in content, and new courses.

The board of education encourages and supports the continual review of the school district's curricular offerings and their content. Upon the annual reorganization of the board of education a board of education curriculum committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee will work with faculty curriculum committees in the review and development of school curricular materials or changes in course content. This committee will make timely reports to the whole board of proposed modifications or changes. The board of education shall approve the addition or deletion of any courses to the curriculum.

Course descriptions and/or course of studies shall be prepared for the board of education by teachers and administrators, for adoption by the board of education.

The administration shall have the responsibility for the general coordination and oversee the formation, review, and updating of all courses of studies and course descriptions.

Prior to the addition or deletion of any courses the procedures set forth in 603.04R1, Steps For Adding New Courses or Implementation of Experimental or Innovative Programs shall be followed.
